

APPLE TREES

Gold-Rush Apple



This late maturing (early November) yellow apple has an excellent flavor that is best after two months in storage. The crisp texture is retained for up to 7 months in cold storage. Fruit size is 2 1/2 to 3" and the skin is thin to medium thickness. Great quality and storage traits with the added bonus of being disease resistant, field immune to scab, and highly resistant to powdery mildew. **Fruits in early November.**



Honeycrisp Apple



Released by the University of Minnesota, Honeycrisp™ is a real crowd pleaser. The fruit is large and the skin is 50-90% red over yellow background. The flesh is cream colored and exceptionally crisp and juicy with a sub-acid flavor. Ripening date is about one week after MacIntosh. **Fruits mid to late September.**

Jonagored Apple



This mutation of Jonagold, discovered on a farm in Belgium, has become the most popular Jonagold strain in Europe. Jonagored develops 80-85% dark red color at maturity. Fruit stores very well and has good quality. **Fruits in October.**



Paula Red Apple



Beautiful solid red blush color far ahead of other apples. Hangs well, stores well, and colors evenly. Flavor is tart, light to creamy flesh and is equally good for eating, sauces or pies. Chemical thinning recommended to maintain size and annual crops. **Fruits in August.**

Wolf River Apple



Large to very large size—pies have been made from one apple. Primarily a cooking apple. Shape is round and sometimes flattened. Color is pale yellow to green with carmine red blushes and stripes. Tree is hardy in northern latitudes. **Fruits in September.**

CHERRY TREES



Balaton Cherry

A new high quality tart cherry which ripens shortly after Montmorency. Compared to Montmorency cherries, the fruit is firmer, sweeter, and has more pigment. It also produces a larger fruit and pit. Young trees grow very vigorously. The tree fruits in mid to late July.



The Balaton cherry "is a superior cherry for juice - the primary use of tart cherries" says the Cherry Marketing Institute of Michigan. Its red pigment is so deep, it won't require red coloring for pie fillings, and its increased sweetness (over the more traditional Montmorency variety) requires fewer pounds to make a gallon of concentrate juice. The Balaton's vibrant color makes it especially appealing.

WhiteGold Cherry



WhiteGold is a beautiful, large, sweet cherry with a shiny red blush over yellow skin. It has firm, clear yellow flesh and is extremely hard. WhiteGold is completely self fertile. It ripens and blooms with Emperor Francis and is an excellent pollinator for that variety. WhiteGold is extremely hardy, very productive and frost tolerant. It is also very tolerant of Cherry Leaf Spot. WhiteGold has good crack resistance and a vigorous, high yielding tree. WhiteGold is the perfect cherry for Emperor Francis processing blocks, as a reliable pollinator for other midseason cherries or as a beautiful, self-fertile, white sweet cherry for direct markets. **Fruits in July.**

PEACH TREES



Redhaven Peach

Good for freezing, canning and shipping. Wood and buds on Redhaven are hardy and disease resistant. Fruit sets heavily, must be thinned early to reach good size. **Fruits in August.**



Flamin' Fury Peach

Ripens end of the Redhaven season. Very prolific, so requires heavy thinning. With heavy trimming and thinning, the peach is classed with good size, high color, excellent flavor, and good firmness. Bac spot resistant, freestone. **Fruits in August.**
